Welcome to Open Competitive Exhibits – the Creative Living and Home Arts exhibits. Items will be exhibited in the Lee Civic Center. The Lee Civic Center will close at 8pm on weekdays and at 10pm on weekends.

So maybe it's been awhile since you fit into your FFA jacket, or maybe you never even were in FFA or 4-H as a youth, but you always thought it would be fun to enter something in the Fair. Maybe you're a youngster now, but you're not in 4-H or FFA, but you like to do crafts, or bake, or you've grown a giant squash in your garden at home, etc. Well, that's what the "Open Class" is all about: If you're too old to be in 4-H or FFA, or you're not in 4-H or FFA now, but you still want to try for a blue ribbon at the Fair, the Open Class is how you'll enter!

The primary purpose of the Fair is to provide a place to display livestock, agriculture, crafts and the like in a safe, family-oriented environment. The Southwest Florida & Lee County Fair is a special annual event of limited duration, with a specific objective of providing thousands of attendees an educational and entertainment experience, serving a main audience of family and youth, in a safe, family-oriented environment.

If you, or your hobby, arts or crafts group would be interested in volunteering or performing a demonstration in any of the Departments offered, or if you have questions or suggestions concerning entries, please call the Fair Office at 239-543-8364.

Registration is FREE and open to residents of Charlotte, Collier, Desoto, Glades, Hendry and Lee County. Please go to [www.swflcfair.com](http://www.swflcfair.com) to register in the Creative Living and Home Arts Department – for all your Open Competitive Exhibits. All registration will be make online this year.

Pre-registration closes February 20, 2019, but that does not mean you cannot make your entry. If you miss the pre-registration deadline, you can register on entry drop off day – you'll just have to make your entry by electronic means that time. Please allow yourself enough time, as we will stop the line at closing time.

## Quick Tips for entering a competition at the Fair:

- Don't wait till the last minute to enter. At 11:59 pm on the day of online registration, no one will be in the office to answer your phone call if you have trouble entering. Don't procrastinate, enter early!
- Print and/or read all the entry information provided before entering online. Some Divisions have **additional** rules. This information will aid you with the entry process and help to ensure you are entering the correct classes. Remember when you click "submit" at the end of the online entry process, you are agreeing that you have read, understand, and will abide by all rules and regulations found in the entry information.
- Take your time with the entry process. Double-check your typing to confirm that all the information you have entered is correct before moving on to the next step. The information entered here will be printed on the entry tags that will go on your work during the Fair. Please make sure your name, address, and email address are all correct.
- When registering online, please don't hit "Check Out" until you are done with all of your entries and ready for the Fair to receive them. Once you check out you won't be able to make changes. Hit "Save Cart" to come back and enter or edit your entries later. However, you must "Check Out" before the deadline, or you will not be registered.

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## Registration and General Rule Information:

Pre-Registration is encouraged and in some divisions is *mandatory*. **You must pre-register if you have more than 10 items to enter.** Online registration is located at [www.swflcfair.com](http://www.swflcfair.com). Pre-registration will close at **4:30 pm on Wednesday, February 20, 2019**. Pre-registration will ensure your entry tags and forms will be completed and ready when you arrive with your exhibit items. When registering online or on the respective drop off day you are granting the Fair Association permission to use information about your entry at the Association's discretion without compensation or further approval. No exhibitor passes are given. ***When registering on drop-of day, electronic registration will be required at that time.*** Please allow yourself time to make your entries electronically. General Rules and individual Division Rules are strictly adhered to. Please be sure to read and know the rules for all departments and divisions. Please help us to not have to eliminate your entry as a result of rules not being followed.

### **Release Date:**

### **General Rules:**

1. The Creative Living, and Home Arts Exhibits are for open competition, exhibition, education, and demonstration purposes. Sale of exhibit item(s) is prohibited.
2. Any item that does not meet the requirements will not be accepted. If an item is accepted as an oversight, it may later be disqualified and/or not judged or displayed.
3. All articles must be clean, handiwork of the exhibitor, and have been completed between February, 2018 and February, 2019, except for Fabrics & Threads.
4. Entries will be accepted at the Southwest Florida & Lee County Fairgrounds, inside the Lee Civic Center, on the designated days and times, as stated on the Entry Calendar. See General Rule #8 for pick-up details.
5. All Entry will be made via the online system, even if dropping off on entry day. Pre-registration is available online and is strongly encouraged.
6. Teachers or group representatives must pre-register their entries online.
7. Exhibitors with a large number of entries (more than 10) must preregister online and must arrive early enough on the respective drop-off day to allow ample time for registration to be completed by 4 pm on the day of entry.
8. Exhibits cannot be picked up without the claim check you receive when dropping off your exhibit item. The Fair Association is not responsible for and will dispose of any remaining articles not picked up by 2pm on Friday, March 15<sup>th</sup>. Please remember, items, ribbons, and premium monies will not be available before 4pm on Sunday, March 10<sup>th</sup>

9. Each entry will be judged on its own merit, using the Danish System of Judging. Judging is done by the most qualified judges available and their decision will be final. The name of the exhibitors are concealed during judging so that each entry will be judged fairly on its own merit. The entry of only one item in a division does not necessarily guarantee the top award for that entry. Items will not be accepted for judging that have been previously exhibited in the Southwest Florida & Lee County Fair. All articles must be clean, be the handiwork of the exhibitor, and have been completed between February, 2018 and February, 2019, except for Fabrics and Threads.
10. All protests must be made in writing or by email to the Southwest Florida & Lee County Fair Association and mailed/mailed to: Fair Manager, 11831 Bayshore Rd, North Fort Myers, Florida, 33917 or [fcrone@leeciviccenter.com](mailto:fcrone@leeciviccenter.com)
11. All Exhibits are under the management of the Fair Association. The Fair Association will take every precaution to protect exhibits, however the Association, it's Officers or Agents will not be responsible for accident, loss, or damage of any entry. The Fair Association reserves the right to display or not to display any time.

## About the Danish System of Judging

The Danish System of Judging is based upon established standards of quality for each type of product. In this system each exhibit is judged according to how well it meets that standard rather than how it compares with other exhibits.

The judge evaluates whether the requirements have been met. Ribbons are awarded according to the degree that the exhibitor's project meets the standards. Also, in the Danish System, everyone whose work fulfills the minimum qualifications receives a ribbon.

"Excellent" Blue Ribbon Award - Exhibits that rank "Excellent meets the standards and fit well within the ability of most of the exhibitors." Excellent does not indicate perfection, but indicates a high degree of achievement toward the elements in the standards for the exhibits. \$5.00 Premium

"Good" Red Ribbon Award - Exhibits that rank "Good" in relation to the project standards or expected achievement. Red indicates good quality; however, there is room for improvement in the exhibit. \$3.00 Premium.

"Fair" White Ribbon Award - Exhibits that barely meet the product standards and need improvement. \$2.00 Premium.

"PARTICIPANT" Red, White & Blue Ribbon Award - no premium monies, does not meet judging standards, but is displayed. .00 Premium.

Best in Division - the very best of the exhibits. There is no limit to the number of Blue Rosettes awarded. Best of Show awards will be chosen from the Blue Rosette winning exhibits. \$6.00 Premium.

Best of Show - One "Best of Show" awarded in some areas of the Creative Living and Home Arts Department for both Youth and Adult. \$10.00 Premium.

People's Choice, Purple Rosette - This award is determined by votes from the public. .00 Premium

## Penmanship Rules

- All General Rules Apply – see page 3.
- Limit of one (1) entry per Exhibitor.
- Each entry may be no more than one page.
- Locate the writing that pertains to your age group, write exactly as it appears;
- Online registration is encouraged. Read paper rules and bring your paper on entry day or mail to: Southwest Florida & Lee County Fair - Creative Living, 11831 Bayshore Rd., N. Ft. Myers, FL, 33917.
- Drop off dates and times are located on page 4.

**\*Junior Youth** - may use hand printing or cursive. If you use hand printing use excerpt # 1. If you use cursive use excerpt # 2. If printing, you may use paper with a dashed middle line to help in uniform printing of letters. Pencil is recommended, but not mandatory. Paper should measure 8 ½ x 11 and have no decorations, or holes for binders. Read other rules about paper type below:

- Paper for all age groups should measure 8 ½ x 11 and have no decorations, or holes for binders.
- Lined penmanship paper is suggested, but unlined paper is acceptable.
- If penmanship paper is not available, paper from an 8 ½ x 11 white legal pad is acceptable.
- Paper that is not acceptable includes filler paper with holes, paper with a dashed line, paper from a spiral notebook and colored paper.
- Use black or blue ball point pen, not a felt tip pen or fountain pen.
- Entries should not be mounted on construction paper, poster board or any other material.
- Name, must appear on front, top right hand corner of entry, written directly on paper.

### JUDGING CRITERIA INCLUDES:

- a. Correct formation of letters
- b. Even spacing between letters, words, and lines
- c. Appropriate margins (at least ½ inch on all sides of the paper)
- d. Adherence to one method of writing (all printing or all cursive)
- e. Exactness to excerpt presented (punctuation, no omitted words, no misspelled words, etc.)
- f. Overall neatness

### **WRITING # 1 (Junior Youth – Ages 6-12 – hand printing only)**

One morning, Pooh and Piglet were walking through the Hundred Acre Wood, when they spied a strange creature lying on the ground. As they got closer, they could see that it looked a bit like a very large boy.

### **WRITING # 2 (Junior Youth – Ages 6 – 12 – cursive only) (Senior Youth – Ages 13 – 20)**

People observe the colors of a day only at its beginnings and ends, but to me it's quite clear that a day merges through a multitude of shades and intonations, with each passing moment. A single hour can consist of thousands of different colors.

**WRITING # 3**    *(Adult Ages 21 – 64)*

No matter what you do in life, be original. Be real. Stop trying to blend in and make a difference in the world by not being like everyone else! Life feels so much more fulfilling when you can be your authentic self. Don't stop dreaming.

**WRITING # 4**    *(Senior Adult Ages 65+)*

Here is the recipe for happiness - take 2 heaping cups of patience, 1 heartful of love, 2 handfuls of generosity, 1 head full of understanding, a dash of laughter, and sprinkle generously with kindness. Add plenty of faith and mix well. Spread over a lifetime, and serve everyone you meet.

## Canned Foods & Culinary

### Canned Food and Culinary Rules:

- All General Rules Apply – see page 3.
- One entry per person, per class.
- Items must be in clear, standard, sealed canning jars with lids in good condition - dirty or rusted rings will result in elimination.
- Each Entry must be labeled with name of product and date canned – must have been canned since March 1, 2018. .
- Recipe and method of canning must be attached to each entry. No artificial coloring permitted.
- Bring two jars of the same item, first jar for display, second jar can be small to be opened and judged.

- Entry must have the recipe attached on a 4"x6" index card, and showing if a mix was used.
- Entries must be in or on a disposable covered container.
- Bread and Cakes must be in their original uncut form – no 'pieces' will be accepted.
- Cupcakes, Cookies, Brownies, Muffins, Rolls & Candy – 10 pieces per entry required.
- No entries will be returned to the exhibitor.

- Cakes will be on display through entire fair (Feb 28-Mar10).
- Entries will be judged on originality, creativity, workmanship and degree of difficulty and overall appearance.
- This competition is open to all cake decorators (beginners to masters) as well as culinary and cake decorating students.
- No moving parts are allowed.
- Cake base is to be no larger than 20" x 20", as maximum display area is 24".
- Entry may be the work of one exhibitor or a group.
- Only one entry per exhibitor or group.

Recycled Art Rules:

- All General Rules Apply – see page 3.

Recycled Art Rules:

- Limit 2 entries per exhibitor.
- Design an item from recyclable and/or non-recyclable material where the materials are used for a purpose other than its original use and remade into an object. Project may use many different materials.
- No poison or hazardous materials may be used or displayed.
- A picture of the item must be taken before the recycling process and must be included with each entry and your description. A description of the item(s) prior to start and the procedure used to accomplish your new creation must be included.
- Please type or print description on one or more index cards.
- Judging will be based on descriptive information, construction difficulty, creative use of item, and overall success in the reclamation process. (Examples of items to make: jewelry, baskets, ornament, toys, wall hangings, vests, etc.)

- All entries must be framed, except canvas gallery wrap paintings with finished sides.
- All entries except canvas gallery wrap paintings must be ready to hang.
- Only wire hangers all the way across back of frames will be accepted, no saw tooth hangers. Tape is not allowed on frame or back.
- Name must appear on the back of entry, upper right corner.
- All entries must be consistent with the family program and Fair Management reserves the right to display or not to display any item.

- All pictures must have a mat framing, and after adding the mat, the full 8" x 10" photo must show.
- Photos in frames or anything other than mat framing will not be accepted.
- Name must be on the back on the entry, upper right corner.
- All entries must be consistent with the family program and Fair Management reserves the right to display or not to display any item.
- If your photography has been digitally enhanced or is computer art, please make sure you are in correct class.
