- Date: Sunday, February 27, 2022
  - Time: 1:30 pm – 4:00 pm
  - Check-in begins at 1:30 pm; Puzzling begins at 2:00 pm; Puzzling Ends at 4:00 pm
  - Location: Whaley Hall – Located on the Fairgrounds, 11831 Bayshore Road, North Fort Myers, Florida 33917
  - Competition is limited to 4 teams in each age division
  - Teams consist of 3 – 4 members
  - Each team will be provided an unopened puzzle – all puzzles will be the same for the respective age division
  - Prizes will be awarded to the top two teams
  - Winning team will receive a Trophy, each member will receive a Mega Pass and \$20 in Food Fair Bucks
  - Second Place team members will each receive a Mega Pass
  - Team Members only will be granted gate access the day of the competition, participants will park in the main parking lot off of Bayshore Road, unless you are in the Livestock Program and have a parking pass for Livestock Parking. Parking is always free at the Fair. Further details will be provided to team members upon registration.
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- Each team receives the same puzzle for the respective age division
  - No one gets to see the puzzle until the timer begins – the puzzle boxes are placed face down before the competition starts
  - Teams try to put the puzzle together the fastest
  - Competitions are a specified amount of time; if there is no declared winner by the end of the time limit, the winner is chosen by their remaining number of loose pieces
  - In the event of a tie, individuals or teams can be given an additional five minutes to work on the puzzle
  - There are no devices (and cell phones must be silenced during the competition) or outside assistance permitted during the competition
  - A minimum of three (3) moderators will help with the event – one to handle the timer and completion times, and two to observe and ensure that competitors are abiding by the rules. Additional moderators will assist as needed.
  - Individuals and teams are not allowed to distract or approach team tables when the competition is in progress.
  - Spectators are allowed to watch from a designated area, but must remain respectful of the need of the participants to focus, and are not allowed to distract or approach tables when the competition is in progress
